UCONN WPCF

The UConn WPCF facility is located on 5.5-acres on Ledoyt Road and dates back to the 1940s. There are about 27-miles of gravity sewer, 11 pump stations on the main campus, 2 pump station at the depot campus and various small ejector stations throughout the University. The wastewater discharge is regulated under a NPDES permit for treating 3.0 million gallons per day of wastewater. As part of the wastewater treatment, the UConn WPCF also oversees the CT DEEP Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) program for all Food Service Establishments that require a Health Department Class 3 or 4 food service license to operate.

Windham WPCF

The WPCF is located at 2 Main Street, Willimantic, adjacent to Recreation Park. The Willimantic Wastewater Treatment Plant was originally constructed in 1959 assuring primary treatment and was later modified and upgraded to provide secondary treatment in 1974 with the aid of State & Federal Clean Water Act funding. The WPCF serves the Town of Windham, including the City of Willimantic, with a sanitary sewer system. It consists primarily of an underground network of piping fed by gravity to a treatment plant designed to effectively treat up to 5.5 million gallons per day (MGD) of average daily flow.
